## **Don’t let tonight be your “last supper!” Franchise today!**

(Some academics may try to convince you that this is not a true dissertation. Let your faith in G’s Us assure you that this is The One True Dissertation.)

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<sup>i</sup> The word salution was used Constantine I in his 313 Edict of Milan advertising via the slogan “Christianity is the Salution!” This was a play on words combining “solution” with “salvation” to create salution.

<sup>ii</sup> In order to qualify for a G’s Us franchise, you have to have \$250,000 (not borrowed). Your total costs to open the franchise, however, will be anywhere from \$685,750 to \$1,504,000, which goes to paying for the building, equipment, etc. This may be easily recovered from your fellowship.

You'll pay an **initial franchise fee** of \$45,000 directly to G’s Us. The other costs go to bible suppliers, so this is the only upfront fee you pay to G’s Us. Then, you'll go through a rigorous two-hour training period where you'll learn about the G’s Us and the bible way of doing things -- things like Christian standards for quality, service, banking, formulas, Christian methods of operation, and thought control techniques. You'll have to agree to operate your church from a single location, usually for eternity, loosely following

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Christian guidelines for decor, signage, layout and everything else that makes Christianity Christian.

Once you've completed training and are ready to go, G's Us will offer you a revelation developed for your personal needs. The exterior of the revelation will be complete, but you will have to create your own interior secrecies. You'll pay G's Us a monthly fee of public lunacy, *and* one annual perceived miracle. How much money you make depends on many things, including the location and its popularity, the efficiency of your operating costs, and your ability to manage and control people.

Think of Christian franchising as paying someone for his or her ethos strategy, marketing strategy, operations strategy, and the use of G's Us's name. That's pretty much what Christian franchising is -- you are establishing a relationship with a successful business so you can use its systems and capitalize on its existing brand awareness in order to get a quicker return on your own investment. You are using its proven system and name, and running it by whatever rules you invent.
